Health is defined by the World Health Organization as a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease and infirmity. (WHO, Migration and Health, 1986).

PART A

BASIC HEALTH PREVENTIVE MEASURES

Prevention is the best way to address major diseases of our time. The aim of prevention is to detect any change in the health status, to identify it early and to treat it effectively. Primary prevention involves healthy living (i.e. healthy eating, avoiding smoking, exercise), while secondary prevention refers to preventative tests to detect diseases before they manifest with clinical symptoms.

WOMEN

Reproductive health is associated with the satisfying and safe sex life of the individual and the ability to reproduce freely. The reproductive health of women is promoted through regular medical-gynecological updates and examinations. Women should have the following tests:

- For an early diagnosis of breast cancer: a mammo-
graphy for women aged between 40 - 50 years every
two years and every year for women aged > 50 years
- For an early diagnosis, of cervix cancer: an annual
PAP test for all sexually active women
- A vaccine against Cervical Cancer for girls and young
women from 12 to 26 years

Insured women are examined free of charge following an ap-
pointment at the outpatient clinics of public hospitals and
health units of the country.

In addition, the following prenatal examinations are manda-
tory for insured women in order for them to give birth to
healthy children:

- Tests to determine thalassemia heterozygotes
- hemoglobin electrophoresis
- examination of fetal DNA
- Identification of rubella antibodies
- Control fetal karyotyping in women over 35

They are carried out for free at public hospitals and EOPYY
Health Units.

Immigrant women who do not reside legally in the country
are not entitled to free prenatal care and childbirth. The only
exception is a conduction of prenatal examinations exclu-
sively for pregnant minors.

ADOLESCENTS

Adolescence is a transitional stage during which the child passes gradually through to the phase of adulthood. Due to the changes in the body and the physique it is recommended for teenagers to undergo the following laboratory examinations annually:

- Complete blood count and urinalysis annually.
- A cholesterol examination especially for adolescents with a family history of cardiovascular disease.
- A fasting blood sugar test every two years for adolescents with a family history of type II diabetes for relatives of the 1st or 2nd degree.

Tests are carried out in Regular Outpatient Clinics of all hospitals in the country, in the National Health Service's (EOPYY) health units and Health Centers.

Vaccination



The vaccinations that all adolescents should have are:

1. The series of DTP (Td is recommended to be repeated every decade)
2. Poliomyelitis
3. Two doses of MMR
4. The series of vaccinations for hepatitis B
5. Vaccination for hepatitis A
6. Meningococcal Type C conjugate vaccine
7. Chickenpox in the event that they have not been ill with it
8. Vaccination against Cervical Cancer (for girls and young women from 12 till 26 years).

The main vaccinations are covered by the Insurance Funds.

PREVENTION AND DETOXICATION FROM SUBSTANCES: SMOKING-ALCOHOL-NARCOTICS

SMOKING



Smoking is a risk to the human body. Diseases associated with smoking are lung cancer, chronic lung disease, osteoporosis, cancers of the mouth, esophagus, as well as fertility and pregnancy problems.

Smoking Cessation Clinics operate in Public and private Hospitals in the country.

ALCOHOL



Alcohol causes physical and psychological dependence, it can cause illnesses and even death due to liver damage.

NARCOTIC SUBSTANCES



Narcotics are chemical substances that cause dependence and their overuse leads to death. It is recommended that the assistance of experts should be asked for promptly for any kind of dependence.

PART B
PREVENTIVE MEASURES FROM DANGEROUS DISEASES

PREVENTING INFECTIOUS DISEASES

Infectious or contagious diseases are due to violations in the body from pathogen factors that are transmitted to other individuals who either become ill or become carriers of the disease.

Infectious diseases can cause an epidemic in a given population, while in many cases they can even result in death. For this reason it is vital to deal with them immediately. Adopting rules for individual and public hygiene and vaccination are the most effective measures to prevent the transmission of diseases.

1. HEPATITIS

Hepatitis is a disease of the liver. The most common forms of hepatitis are Hepatitis A, B or C.

Hepatitis A is a curable disease of the liver from the virus HAV and can last from a few weeks to several months. Risk of infection is by:

- Contaminated public areas (i.e. toilets)
- Contaminated water, raw foods washed with contaminated water
- Close contact with infected individuals

Hepatitis B is a liver inflammation caused by the virus (HBV). Risk of infection is by:

- sexual contact with infected individuals
- items contaminated with blood (i.e. syringes, razors, toothbrushes, needles)
- contact with infected individuals
- infected mother (infant at birth)

Hepatitis C

Risk of infection is by:

- items contaminated with blood
- sexual contact with infected individuals
- infected mother (infant at birth)

How can I find out if I have hepatitis?

A special blood test is necessary. The test can be carried out at External Hepatology Clinics in public hospitals across the country. It is recommended that the test be carried out once a year.

How can I prevent hepatitis?

Hepatitis A and B can be prevented by vaccinations. Vaccinations are recommended for children under the age of one year for persons traveling to countries with high infection rates. The vaccine for Hepatitis B is carried out in three doses and is repeated every 3-5 years. There is no vaccine for the treatment of hepatitis C.

Vaccinations for hepatitis are carried out at any public hospital. Vaccinations can also be bought from pharmacies and pharmacists can do them. Especially asylum seekers can be immunized at Medical-Social Welfare Centers (formerly PIKPA).

Protective measures against Hepatitis A, B, C:

- Strict personal hygiene rules
- Use of condom during sexual intercourse
- Individual use of syringes, scissors, razors etc.
- Use of sterile tools for nail care, acupuncture, tattooing, piercing for earrings, etc.
- immunization (for Hepatitis A, B)

2. TUBERCULOSIS

A contagious disease caused by bacteria. It usually affects the lungs and other body organs such as the bones, larynx, etc.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of TB include extreme weakness, weight loss, fever, night sweats, coughs, chest pain and hemoptysis.

How is it transmitted?

Tuberculosis is spread by coughing, intense speaking, sneezing and laughing.

How can I learn if I have TB?

The mantoux screening test is the only way to diagnose tuberculosis. The test is carried out in hospitals, health centers, EOPYY clinics and health services across the country. The vaccine (BCG) for tuberculosis is carried out in infants and young children at the age of 6 years. The tuberculostatic vaccine does not fully protect from the disease. TB is cured completely but slowly (longer than 6 months).

How can I protect those around me?

- By taking the correct medication
- Covering the mouth with a handkerchief when coughing and sneezing

- Avoiding close contact with other individuals especially at school and work
- Frequent ventilation of living space

The disease is non-contagious two to three weeks after therapy has started. If the doctor agrees you can return to your daily activities

3. HIV / AIDS



HIV is a virus that infects the human body. When someone becomes infected, he/she will always remain a seropositive HIV carrier and can transmit the disease to other individuals. The person who becomes sick with AIDS has a weakened immune system and in many cases dies. Currently there is no cure for HIV.



How is it transmitted?

- By sexual contact (vaginal, anal, oral) without using a condom with someone who is infected with the virus.
- By having sex without a condom with intravenous drug users.
- Using non-sterile needles
- By sharing syringes or needles for intravenous narcotics
- From a mother who has the virus

How can I find out if I have contracted the virus?

A diagnostic test has to be carried out. It can either be done for free at a public hospital or at a private diagnostic-microbiology laboratory which will be paid. It is done anonymously

and the results are confidential. The test is also carried out in any AIDS national reference center.

4. MALARIA

Malaria is a contagious disease that infects red blood cells. It causes serious infections and if it is not treated with the proper treatment, it can lead to death.

How is it transmitted?

With a bite from an infected mosquito, blood transfusion, organ transplantation and with the use of contaminated needles or syringes. It is rarely transmitted from mother to fetus.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of malaria include a high fever with chills, sweating, headaches, muscle pain, nausea, diarrhea, vomiting, anemia, yellowing of the eyes, skin and mucous membranes (jaundice).

How can I find out if I have malaria?

Malaria is diagnosed by a blood test. The test may be conducted in public hospitals.

How is malaria cured?

It is treated with medication. Therapy has to start promptly.

5. WEST NILE VIRUS

It is a disease that is mainly transmitted by the bite of an infected mosquito and rarely by transfusions, transplantations or from a mother to a fetus. It is not transmitted from person to person through normal social (e.g. touch, kiss), sexual or other contact. If they get infected, individuals aged over 50 years are at a higher risk of getting sick more severely.

What are the symptoms?

Most people display no symptoms. Mild symptoms include fever, fatigue, headaches, muscle pain, pain in bones and joints, vomiting, rashes and sometimes swelling of the lymph nodes. Severe symptoms of the disease (occurring in less than 1% of patients) include high fever, headaches, neck stiffness, disorientation, tremors, coma, muscle paralysis. If untreated promptly, the disease can lead to encephalitis, meningitis, meningoenkephalitis or flaccid paralysis. Symptoms usually appear 2-14 days after the insect bite.

How can I find out if I have the West Nile Virus and how is it treated?

The patient should seek medical attention. In mild cases the symptoms subside after several days. In more severe cases admittance to hospitalization is necessary. There is no available vaccine against the virus.

General protection from insects

To safeguard against insects the following measures can be taken:

- use insect repellants on uncovered skin and over clothes, especially from dusk to dawn.
- use clothes that cover the body (long sleeves and pants)
- Cleansing baths often to remove sweat
- Installation of mosquito meshes (screens) in the windows of the house
- use of insecticides
- removal of standing water from basins, jars, pots, etc.
- use of fans and air conditioning
- use yellow light bulbs for outdoor lighting

6. SEXUAL HEALTH – PRECAUTIONS FROM SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASES

Sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) such as chlamydia, syphilis, gonorrhea, genital warts and genital herpes, are transmitted from one person to another during sexual contact. They are transmitted through vaginal, anal and oral sex.

What are the symptoms?

Sexually transmitted diseases cause discomfort and pain in the genital area. If not addressed with appropriate treatment, they can cause infertility and even cancer.

What should I do?

If you think you may be infected, visit a doctor immediately in order to have the appropriate treatment recommended. In addition:

- Advise your sexual partner to visit a doctor
- Restrict your number of sexual partners
- Do not have sex if your partner has already been infected or feels discomfort
- After sexual contact urinate and wash the genital area as soon as possible.

How can I protect myself?



Use a condom in every sexual encounter. The use of a condom reduces the chance of sexually transmittable diseases being transferred. In addition its use prevents the transmission of infectious diseases such as HEPATITIS.



Where can I obtain information?

Outpatient clinics of the National Health Service hospitals provide free medical care and treatment to foreigners who are infected with the HIV infection or other contagious diseases.

7. MENTAL HEALTH

Psychosocial problems are frequent and cause feelings of sadness, anxiety, depression, fatigue, exhaustion, hopelessness, or hyperactivity, anxiety or resignation. These symptoms may be resolved with the appropriate help. Psychosocial support services are provided to children and adults, as well as groups or families for free, insurance is not necessary and the confidentiality of personal information is upheld. Moreover, information is often available in other languages as well.

PART C

STRUCTURE AND ORGANIZATION OF THE HEALTH SYSTEM

1. The structure of the Greek health system

Health care in Greece is provided by the National Health Service (NHS). The NHS provides medical coverage to the population residing in the country legally. Primary Health Services (i.e. services and examinations in relation to prevention and diagnosis) are offered at rural clinics, municipal polyclinics, regional health centers, outpatient clinics and hospital Emergency Departments (ED).

For insured individuals, health care services are provided by Social Security Funds with the main one being the National Health Service Organization (EOPYY). Since 2011 the health sectors of the insurance funds IKA-ETAM, OGA, OAEE-TEVE and OPAP/TYDKY have become integrated into a single insurer EOPYY.

Insurance is compulsory and covers Greeks and foreign workers (employed and freelance professionals) and retirees (directly insured), as well as the members of their families and the unemployed. The health benefits covered by the insurance organizations are:

- Primary medical and dental care (prevention and diagnosis of diseases without a hospital stay, medication, emergency ambulance transport by EKAV ambulances, home care, etc.)
- Hospital care
- Pharmaceutical care
- Additional care

In the Greek health system there are private providers of health services, such as private practices, clinics and maternity hospitals.

2. Access to health services in public hospitals

Visits to outpatient clinics for check-ups are by appointment. A medical examination in the morning outpatient clinics costs 5 euros. Monitoring is free only for patients of the TB Clinic.

Assessment Procedure

Outpatient Clinics Examination

1. For scheduled appointments at Regular Outpatient Hospital Clinics, Patient Cards are required. Patient Cards are issued at the Outpatient Clinic Secretariat
2. Patients should receive priority service numbers
3. Communication with the Outpatient Clinic Secretariat – Funds and fee payment for examination
4. Issuance of a referral note and waiting for an examination



Hospital Admittance process

Patient admittance to hospitals of the country is carried out with the following procedure:

- Anyone who needs medical care goes to the emergency hospital on call.
- He/she is examined for free and if the incident is deemed urgent, the individual concerned is admitted to the hospital.
- He/she must bring his/her passport and health booklet.

The cost of the admittance process is about 15 euros, whilst treatment in the hospital costs 60 euros per day on average. If the patient is insured, medical expenses are covered by his/her insurance agency and he/she pays a fraction of the cost of hospitalization. If the patient has no insurance and a health card, he/she must pay the entire amount.

Those who are insured can visit the large hospitals that are on call and have a dental department.

Basic medical and pharmaceutical care is provided by other services as well by the public sector, as well as by non-profit organizations.

CITY OF ATHENS MUNICIPALITY CLINIC

PART D RIGHTS AND SUPPORT SERVICES

1. Health service access to legally residing migrants

Foreign nationals residing legally in the country have equal rights to Greek citizens in national insurance and social protection (Law 2910/2001). The entitlement to health care benefits is proven with the health book of the organizations /insurance funds.



Supplies

Health benefits that the insured are entitled to include:

Protecting Health

Are provided mandatorily and without the participation of the insured individual: a) Vaccination of children and adults, b) prenatal tests to women and men, c) mammograms and PAP tests for an early diagnosis of cancer, d) tests for the prevention of heart disease and e) testing for an early diagnosis of colon cancer and prostate cancer in men.

Vaccinations

For insured individuals, vaccines that fall under the National Vaccination Programme are administered by private pharmacies without the participation of the insured persons. For those who do not have insurance, the vaccine must be purchased at his/her own expense.

Primary Health Care

The insured beneficiary of medical care and the (insured) family members have a right to visit:

- doctors in the EOPYY clinics and their private clinics, when there are no organized health units
- family doctor (wherever applicable)
- the rural doctor
- medical centers.

In addition:

- They can call an in house EOPYY doctor to the place where they are bedridden
- To make general or specific tests or specific treatments in the laboratories of EOPYY or affiliated private laboratories, without charge.
- Be part of a rehabilitation program in special centers.
- To undergo IVF treatment.
- To call for first aid.
- To enter the program of in house regular care.
- To claim a refund of part or all of the money that he/she paid as a fee for a visit to a private physician and for medicine that was administered.

Hospital care

Hospital care is provided in: a) public NHS hospitals, b) university hospitals, c) nursing institutions of a non-profit nature, d) affiliated private clinics, e) rehabilitation centers – inpatient recovery units, f) clinics and institutions for chronic diseases and g) Mental Health Units. EOPYY covers for the hospitalization in the C' class of Public Hospitals and private clinics and infirmaries that are affiliated with EOPYY for insured individuals. If the insured person wishes to be hospitalized in an improved class, he/she pays the difference in cost.

Pharmaceutical Care

EOPYY provides insured individuals complete medical care and the insured persons pay 25% participation for the drugs. (Medicines for the treatment and cure of certain chronic diseases are exempted, in which participation is 10% or granted free

Other Allowances – Cash benefits

In exceptional cases the cost of treatment abroad is covered for serious illnesses when the diagnosis and treatment cannot be carried out in Greece. Insured individuals are entitled to funeral expenses in the case of a directly insured individual's death.

Working Mothers - Maternity

- **Maternity leave**

Working mothers are entitled to a maternity leave of 17 weeks total in duration. The first eight weeks are provided before the expected date of birth and the remaining nine after birth as one unified leave.

- **Allowances**

Women who are directly or indirectly insured who become mothers are provided with pregnancy and maternity allowances.

For insured women who give birth in public hospitals the maternity care allowance is paid directly by the insurer to the hospital. Insured mothers do not pay medical expenses.

In the case of birth in private clinics the maternity care allowance is paid directly to the insured women and they pay for hospitalization themselves.

For more information individuals can contact the Department of Health Benefits of their insurance agencies.

Health matter at work and workplace accidents

There is an assimilation of foreign and Greek workers with regards to work related accidents (Decree 30/10/1935). The employer is responsible for the safety and health of workers in his/her business (Law.1568/85, Directive 89/391/EEC).

Absence from work for health and sickness leave related reasons

In the case of an illness, an employee must notify his/her employer in any manner and submit a medical certificate from an EOPYY doctor. An employee who is absent due to an illness for up to three (3) days shall be entitled to 50% of his/her earnings. If his/her sickness exceeds three days, the employee will receive sick pay from his/her insurance fund from the fourth day and the difference arising from his/her salary and sick pay from his/her employer. Sick leave does not affect the employee's leave and holidays.

Work accident and injury allowances

A work accident is an occurrence that happens to the employee in the course of his/her work or in relation to his/her work and is due to a sudden violent external factor (incident) that causes temporary or lasting inability to work. Employers are obligated to report work accidents to the competent authorities.

If the employee is not insured, the employer pays for the medical expenses and hospital care. Otherwise, the employee is covered by his/her insurance fund. The employee is entitled to sickness benefits during the period of his/her inability to work and the remainder of his/her salary from the employer for a period of 15 days, if he/she has been in employment for less than a year or 1 month for employment over a year.

2. Access to health care for migrants without the necessary documents

Foreigners that are not in the country legally and do not have a passport or another official travel document do not have access to the health care system (MHSS Circular, Article 84/Law.3386/2005). An exception (Article 51, Law 2910/2001) is provided for minors and foreigners who are admitted to care in the Emergency Departments of hospitals until their health is stabilized.

Care provision (examinations, visits to doctors, drugs) is not provided to foreigners who do not reside legally in Greece. An exemption is provided for foreigners without the required documents suffering from HIV or other transmittable diseases, who can receive free medical care from public hospitals. Underage pregnant immigrants without the required documents are entitled to prenatal examinations. Foreigners who are not legally in the country can receive free basic health care at the NGOs' polyclinics.

Illegally employed third country nationals

The recruitment and employment of third country nationals without residence permits or certifications that they have submitted the required documentation for its issuance is illegal.

(Article 86 Law.3448/2006). Employers of illegal third country nationals are punished, as are foreigners who work or are practicing a profession or another economic activity, without a residence permit.

According to Law.4052/2012, illegally employed third-country citizens can approach the courts and competent authorities to enforce their due and legitimate rights in accordance with the labor legislation. Illegal workers can submit complaints themselves (or instead with their consent) at the local labor centers, against their employers.

3. Palinnostountes and ethnic Greeks

Palinnostountes from the former Soviet Union countries and ethnic Greeks from Albania have the same rights to health care access as Greek citizens.

4. Refugees and asylum seekers

Refugees and asylum seekers who have refugee identity cards and asylum application cards, have the same rights as Greek citizens to health services access for as long as these are valid. Especially those who are uninsured or receive low incomes are entitled to free access to primary, secondary care and drug coverage.

Similarly, free medical and pharmaceutical care is offered to uninsured foreigners in Greece with authorization to stay for humanitarian reasons.

Care at reception centers of border areas

In cases of mass arrivals of immigrants without the required country entry documents, the nearest health services are notified, who provide for the passage of the necessary staff. After a first assessment of their condition, they are all given a medical monitoring and examination, while the health services attend to any patients and their transfer to the appropriate Nursing Care Unit.

Mobile Medical Units of KEELPNO that are staffed by qualified personnel carry out systematic checks for infectious diseases and other illnesses in the transient populations entering the country illegally.
